### Principal

- Updates from previous meeting none
- o General school activities
  - Introduced the new Vice Principals, Alena Black and Heather Perkins
  - Special thank you to the Breakfast Program for a great start, and to Council for welcoming Grade 5 families so warmly on the first day.



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- A number of staff changes are still being made and will be announced soon. Grades 5 and 6 each have seven classes this year.
- Sept. 30 is a crucial date for funding calculation based on enrollment. Enrollment was as high as 930 students during the summer. As of the date of this meeting, 919. Projections were estimated at 936.
- Translation Services: CBE has introduced a new service for translation services for communicating with families. Up until now, translation had been done in-house. This new service, the same as what AHS uses, is available on-demand by phone. So far it's been quite effective. The service offers a diverse range of languages, quickly without delay.
- The students have asked for a dance, which will take place the afternoon of October 31 (Halloween). Details are forthcoming.

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### 6. Standing Business

- Breakfast Program Becky provided an update:
  - Program soft launched on June 3. The program has received positive feedback from students, teachers, and admin. For students who are food insecure, the program is a wonderful way to "camouflage" their need as the food is available to all with no restrictions. We know that some students in need were fed, in a supportive, safe environment.
  - The program runs each morning, from approximately 7:45-8 a.m. Becky would like to recruit a small group of volunteers to assist. Becky will offer an orientation for those who would like to learn more. A short AHS food safety video is required. A volunteer sign up is forthcoming.
  - Council initially voted to provide \$1,000 in funding per month through September 2024.
  - For long-term sustainability, Becky is looking for funding from outside sources (i.e. grants). She has submitted an application to Breakfast Clubs of Canada, and is open to ideas for other sources of funding (i.e. corporate sponsorship).
  - In the meantime, Becky requested Council provide up to \$4,000 to fund the breakfast program, October 2024 – January 31, 2025. Juliet motioned; Miranda seconded. Motion carried.
